## **Evaluating for Readability**

Both endorsed by National Institutes of Health

- Simple Measurement of Gobbledygook (SMOG) Overall reading score
- Flesch-Kincaid Reading Ease for assessment at the 6th grade level Evaluates difficulty of a specific passage

The Newest Vital Sign (NVS) is one of the most broadly accepted caregiver health literacy assessment <u>screening</u> tools. It correlates with the Test of Functional Health Literacy in Adults.

- Reliable (Cronbach's alpha 0.76 in English, 0.69 in Spanish) and valid (evaluated across age, health conditions, racial/ethnic groups)
  - Published in the Annals of Family Medicine (12/05): doi: 10.1370/afm.405 (correction to the caption in Figure 2 can be found at doi: 10.1370/afm.506)
  - Validated across caregiving populations (parents of young children, older adults, various racial/ethnic groups, and across a wide variety of health conditions)
- Test-retest reliability in-person and remote: doi: 10.1016/j.pec.2018.11.016
- Available in both English and Spanish; Also translated and tested in a traditional Chinese version (https://doi.org/10.1016/j.bj.2018.07.001)
- 3 minutes to administer
