

American Diabetes Association 2020 guidelines



The new guidelines recommend that providers:

- Look beyond patient's glucose control as measured by HbA1c
- Add medicines that improve cardiovascular and renal outcomes for patients at risk for these complications



Medicines with an "A" grade (indicates highest level of evidence behind recommendation):

- SGLT2 inhibitors
- GLP-1 receptor agonist



Diabetic retinopathy

- Is often the first evidence of vascular disease
- Requires consideration of new medical treatment

- 0.50 or higher steps
- +/- Cross cylinder testing
- Prism

Lighting

Rehabilitation

Therapy

- Eccentric retinal reading
- Field loss rehabilitation
- Spatial vision neuro rehab
 - Vergence eye movements
 - Saccadic eye movements
 - Smooth movement pursuits
 - Accommodation


